Marc is a NY Artist and will feature his new technique for (Virtual) Travel Journaling involving gesture lines intermingled with lush color blobs. He is a representational artist who enjoys reducing images impressionistically to their essentials. Marc is also an art instructor and a photographer. His work has been exhibited in galleries through the NY Metro area. One of his works is in the permanent collection of the NY Art Students League and was included in the League's traveling exhibit alongside those of Georgia O'Keefe, and Norman Rockwell. In 2004 he was featured in Watercolor Magic magazine as "11 Hot Artists to Watch." As a photographer, Marc was an international award winner many times, and is on the board of directors of the Long Island Center of Photography.

Holiday Member Virtual Demonstration

with Kris Kelly

Kris gave a wonderful demonstration/talk on her pursuit of asemic painting which she has studied at the Woodstock School of Art. Asemic painting is a method of mark making that has no meaning, it is a meditative and therapeutic exercise in making calligraphic marks. She showed examples by Wassily Kandinsky and Cy Twombly, who are abstract expressionist artists.

She doesn't start with a concept in her paintings, but assembles her materials and starts working. Sometimes she paints with her eyes closed, or uses both hands, which she finds very freeing. She keeps a notebook of doodles that include lines and shapes, varying in quality and medium. Her paintings include many layers of work and don't necessarily have a traditional focal point. She will often work on a piece, put it aside and then

> return to finish it. She likes to experiment and uses lots of different mediums and substrates.

SOME IDEAS

- Practice doing designs, doodles, shapes, lines
- Keep a mark making notebook
- · Look at other artists' work and other languages-letters, shapes
- · Vary the line thick, thin, color, wiry, curious, calm, frenetic
- Use a variety of media ink, pastel, dirt, acrylic, oil, wax, graphite, w/c
